BAD NEIGHBORS

Which minorities would you rather not be neighbors with?

The World Values survey asked people from different countries to list the groups of people would not like to neighbor. I was particularly interested learning *which nations discriminate more*, and *which are more friendly and tolerant* towards (1) immigrants, (2) homosexuals, (3) people of a different race and (4) people of a different religion. Finally, are certain regions/continents less tolerant than other?

This is how I used their online available tool¹ and gathered data:


- 1. Chose the last wave

2. Selected all countries and questions. The tool did not allow me to select all countries right away or to select all four questions to compare them directly.




The proposed visualization

The visualization I implemented displays a radial plot, in which each country is represented as a curved line that crossed each of the four axes.

At a first glance, it becomes clear that there is more intolerance towards homosexuals in the world.



The lines can also be hovered in order to get information about specific countries..



Finally, they can be filtered by continent and grouped in small multiples in order to view and compare regions individually.
