Assignments that are hard to copy, find or fake

A summary of advice

- 1. New each time
- 2. Demand higher-order thinking skills
- 3. Specify local, recent, specific contexts
- 4. Specify what sources and information to use
- 5. Control the process, get students to start early
- 6. Authenticate the result ('Who did this work?')

Teachers' reactions:

- 1. I teach classes of 150. It is not realistic to expect me to use drafts.
- 2. Students learn by copying others. It doesn't matter if the work is not original.
- 3. It took me ages to write the case study in the assignment. It is not realistic to expect me to make a new one each time
- 4. Marking individual answers takes much more time. I don't have time.
- 5. The rules stop me from changing my assessment. I can't change what I have always done, even if I wanted to.
- 6. It is not my job to stop students from copying. It is their job to be honest.
- 7. When I write the assignment, well, it looks fine to me. How am I supposed to know what students will find easy to copy?
- 8. Thinking up new assignments takes time. I always have to do it at the end of the year when all I want is to go on holiday!
