LEVEL 3: Reporting plagiarism

Yes, if a teacher sees:

- 1. Evidence of attempts to conceal the true author of the work
- 2. Evidence of trying to create a false impression in the marker
- 3. Evidence that the student has been informed about how true work should be presented.

LEVEL 2: Managing plagiarized work

1. Reduce the mark to show that the work does not meet the learning outcomes

Plus

2. call the student in for an interview with the teacher. This is to ensure the student understands what is incorrect and the consequences of continued failure to present 'true' work

or

3. call the student in for an interview with a specialist; ensure the student understands what is required and what will happen in future for this type of work. Keep a record of the interview.

or

4. (3. above) + fail the work FX and require correction

or

5. (3 above) + fail the work F. The student must redo the assessment

LEVEL 1: Marking plagiarized work

1. Reduce the mark to show that the assignment does not meet the learning outcomes

and

2. Inform the student in the feedback the grounds for reducing the mark
