Engineering Education Development 2008 offers opportunities for exchanging experiences of development of Swedish engineering education. - Integration of engineering competencies (such as communication and language skills, teamwork, sustainable development)
- Professional degrees (civilingenjör, högskoleingenjör) vs bachelor and master degrees

Development - implementation:

- o Effective, interesting, active, meaningful learning activities
- Strategies for handling uneven or poor prerequisite knowledge, and the new rules for qualifying to engineering education
- o Linking students with industry in learning activities
- Language of instruction demands, attitudes, and competence of students and instructors

Development - leadership:

- o Program development and program leadership
- o Educational development of engineering education
- o Quality enhancement, evaluation, ranking
